EITHER / OR VERSUS NEITHER / NOR

• **EITHER / OR** (.... o ...)

It is used in a sentence in the <u>affirmative sense</u> when referring to a **choice between two possibilities**.

<u>Example</u>: We can **either** eat now **or** after the show; it's up to you. -> Podemos comer ahora or después del espectáculo; lo que tú prefieras.

• **NEITHER / NOR** (ni... ni...)

It is used in a sentence in the <u>negative sense</u> when you want to say that two or more things are not true.

<u>Example:</u> **Neither** my mother **nor** my father went to university. -> Ni mi madre ni mi padres fueron a la Universidad.

SINGULAR OR PLURAL?

When using either/or and neither/nor, note the following rules:

1. If both elements are singular, then the verb is singular too:

- Either the father or the mother has to attend the meeting. -> Father and mother are singular; so the verb has is singular too.
- Neither Leila nor Nancy is going to write the report. -> Leila and Nancy are singular; so the verb *is* is singular, too.

2. However, if one of the elements is plural, you must use a plural verb:

- Either Sue or the girls are going to prepare dinner tonight. -> The girls are plural; so the verb *are* is plural, too.
- Neither the teacher nor the students were in the classroom this morning. -> The students are plural; so the verb *were* is plural, too.
