

GRAMMAR: MODAL VERBS IN THE PAST

1) Generally speaking, modals in the past have the following **form**:

modal verb + have + past participle

Example:

<u>Present</u>: You **should see** a doctor. <u>Past</u>: You **should have seen** a doctor

2) **Except** for modals that express obligation, ability and lack of necessity:

Obligation:

<u>Present</u> = I must/ have to work hard/ <u>Past</u> = I had to work hard.

Ability:

<u>Present</u> = I can run fast./ <u>Past</u> = I could run fast when I was young.

Lack of necessity:

<u>Present</u> = You **don't have to/ needn't take** your umbrella./ <u>Past</u> = You **didn't have to / didn't need to take** your umbrella.

3) Modal verbs chart

Usage	Modals in the present	Modals in the past
obligation	You must/ have to stop when the traffic lights are red.	You had to stop.
lack of obligation or necessity	You don't have to/ needn't buy any tomatoes. There are plenty in the fridge.	You didn't have to/ didn't need to buy any tomatoes.
certainty	Affirmative: He has a Rolls Royce. He must be very rich.	He must have been rich. He had a big house and an expensive car.

		He can't have written that poem. He was illiterate.
ability	I can run fast.	I could run fast. Now I am old.
prohibition	You mustn't smoke here.	You mustn't have smoked here.
permission	Can I go out?	She could drive her father's car when she was only 15.
possibility	I may/ can/ might/ could rain today. It's cloudy.	I guess it may/ can/ might/ could have been Lacy on the phone
advice	You should see a doctor.	You should have seen a doctor.
