

# THE PAST SIMPLE OF THE VERB 'TO BE'

## o The affirmative form

I, he, she, it	was
you, we, they	were

## Examples:

- I was in London in 1999.
- Pam was in London in 1999, too.
- We were together.
- She was my girlfriend.

## o The interrogative form



Examples:

- Were you in London last year? -> Yes, I was/ No, I wasn't.
- Was Pam with you? -> Yes, she was/ No, she wasn't.
- Were you together? -> Yes, we were/ No, we weren't.

## • The negative form



## Examples:

- I wasn't in Paris in 1999.
- Pam wasn't in Paris in 1999.
- We weren't in Paris.
- o **Remember**
- 1. *wasn't* is the short form of *was not*. You can say either:



- I was not in Paris, or
- I *wasn't* in Paris.
- 2. *weren't* is the short form of *were not*. You can say either:
  - we *were not* in Paris, or
  - we *weren't* in Paris.
