# ✓ PODCAST TRANSCRIPT

### La Liga 2014/2015

#### The Favourites

Atlético de Madrid surprised many last season by winning their 10<sup>th</sup> La Liga title and, despite the fact that they have lost striker Diego Costa, goalkeeper Courtouis and defender Filipe (they have all gone to Chelsea), they have strengthened their side with some interesting signings. In has come French winger Griezmann, from Real Sociedad; and Croatian forward Mario Mandžukić, from Bayern Munich, and they will join the spine of last season's title-winning team that is Koke, Godin, Juanfran, Gabi, Miranda, and of course their inspirational coach Diego Simeone.

Barcelona has a new manager: former player Luis Enrique and he is overseeing a change at the Nou Camp. Barca may be banned from making any signings in the next two transfer windows, so there has been quite a lot of movement in this close season as they attempt to win back their title. Defenders Mathieu, from Valencia, and Vermaelen, from Arsenal, should help to replace the retired Carles Pujol, but perhaps the stand out signing for the Catalan side is Luis Suárez, from Liverpool. He will be forced to miss the first couple of months of the season due to suspension but when he returns, he will form part of a **formidable** attacking force that includes Neymar and Messi.

We tend to forget that Real Madrid were a whisker away from winning an amazing treble last season. Champions League winners for the 10<sup>th</sup> time, they also won the Copa del Rey and finished third in La Liga, but this only after a poor end to the campaign. This season they have added World Cup winner Tony Kroos to their midfield, James Rodríguez to their forward line and Costa Rican goalkeeper Keylor Navas as back up to Iker Casillas in goal. They still have the much-feared 'BBC' front line of Bale, Benzema and Cristiano Ronaldo, and will be yet again one of the favourites to win La Liga.

## Champions League

Athletic Club de Bilbao, who returns to the Champions League this season for the first time in 16 years, has lost midfielder Ander Herrera to Manchester United but the rest of the squad that did so well last year remains and with the new San Mamés stadium now complete, they will be among the favourites to finish in fourth place. Perhaps, their biggest rivals will be Europa League winners Sevilla though they have lost key players, including Ivan Rakitić to Barcelona. Dark horses that could make the top four include Real Sociedad and Villareal, but they will probably have to be satisfied with a top 6 finish instead.

### Relegation

Last year's relegation battle went down to the wire with Osasuna, Valladolid and Betis, all going down to the second division. In their place have come former title winners Deportivo de La Coruña, Córdoba, who will be making their first appearance in the top tier for over 40 years and, for the first time ever, Basque side Eibar. Eibar and Córdoba will struggle as they do not really have the finances to compete at this level while Elche, Levante and my favourite team, Málaga, as well as Madrid side Rayo Vallecano, who may have made too many changes to their team, will also face a relegation battle this season.

### **Predictions**

It will be hard for Atlético to repeat their exploits from last season, while I think Barcelona may have too many new players to bed in this year, so I am going for Real Madrid for the title. As for relegation, I think Eibar, Córdoba and probably Rayo will find themselves in the bottom three come the end of the season.
