

# TYPES OF PASSES

## VOCABULARY

- ✓ **A ONE-TWO:** a wall pass or a pass between two players that opens up a defence -> pase de pared
- ✓ **A CUT BACK:** a pass from a player who reaches the end of the pitch and then passes the ball back towards his forwards -> pase de un jugador que llega al final del terreno de juego y pasa el balón hacia atrás a sus delanteros
- ✓ **TO KNOCK THE BALL AROUND:** to confidently pass the ball to each other -> pasarse el balón con seguridad y confianza
- ✓ **AN EXCHANGE OF PASSES:** expression which means that a team has a period of good build up play; they are passing the ball around well. -> intercambio de pases que sirve para que el juego mejore
- ✓ **A SLIDE RULE PASS:** a very accurate pass -> un pase muy preciso
- ✓ **A THROUGH BALL:** a pass that opens up a defence, so a forward can have a clear chance -> un pase que atraviesa la defensa y, de este modo, un delantero puede tener una clara oportunidad
- ✓ **TO LAY OFF THE BALL:** when a player lays off the ball, he receives the ball and passes it into space for another player. -> pasar el balón a un espacio/ al espacio para que lo controle otro jugador
- ✓ **A PASS TO OPEN SPACE:** when a player passes the ball to an area where a team-mate is running. He must anticipate both direction and speed of his team-mate, as well as the opponent's ones. -> pase a un espacio/ pase al espacio
- ✓ **BACKWARD PASS:** to pass the ball back in order to get your offense set up and maintain control of the ball -> pase hacia atrás para mantener el control del balón
- ✓ **A BACKHEEL:** a kick in which the ball is hit with the heel (or the back) of the foot. -> pase de tacón

As you already know, it is very important for a referee to know as much vocabulary as possible; that is why you have here more terms related to the different types of passes.

Como ya sabes, es muy importante para un árbitro conocer todo el vocabulario posible, por eso aquí tienes más términos relacionados con los distintos tipos de pases.
